I've had some questions about viewing our photographs and updating your contact information. Let's begin with photographs:



- You can access older photos from the CSPS home screen by clicking on Photo Album.

- Newer photos have been uploaded into the Members Only area. To get to them, click on Members Only which is located at the bottom left side of our home screen. Then input our Username and Password. If you forgot what this is, feel free to contact one of the officers. I'm not publishing it for security.

- You will see choices throughout the screen. Feel free to explore. To access the photos, click on the Shutterfly photo or the sentence to the right of the photo. If this is your first time, click on the Sign up link near the bottom. Fill everything out and click Join now.

- For security reasons, you will not join just yet. A message from Shutterfly will be sent to the CSPS

administrators. They will approve you. You will then receive an approval notice and you can simply log in the next time you access Shutterfly.

If you're having problems, contact me for help.

To update your contact information for the CSPS roster, there are two ways to do it. You can contact Doug Jackson, who will update your USPS record along with the roster. Or, you can do it yourself:

- Go to [USPS.org](https://www.usps.org) and click on Member's Log In at the top.

- Enter your E number without the hyphen (-). Then enter your password and click Log in.

- If you don't know your password, click on Forgot your password? and USPS will email you a new password.

- On the right side of the screen, you will see your Member Profile. Check to make sure that everything is correct. To see more information and to make changes, click on Manage Profile.

- Be very careful what you edit. Scroll down to see additional information that cannot be edited.


I attended the Annual Meeting in Orlando, Florida last month and one of the items mentioned was that the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary and USPS are now working together to teach classes. USPS and the National Safe Boating Council signed a MOU at the Annual Meeting and we are now partnering with them. Columbus received two awards, Distinctive Communicator for our web site, and Distinctive Communicator for our publication, the *Galley Gossip*.

It appears USPS is attracting the 50-plus year old target; these are the Baby Boomers who are now the empty nesters and have the time and money for boating. Paddle boaters have had the largest increase in fatalities. The Coast Guard has appointed the Coast Guard Auxiliary to come up with a plan to help address this problem.

USPS is in the black with five million in assets



and no debt. Any rumors that USPS is going down are unfounded!

Our District 29 Spring Conference was held at Ohio Northern University, Ada, Ohio this past weekend. R/C Susan Darcy represented the Chief Commander and the meeting was very informative. We had some very worthwhile seminars. Some may be


