Shortly after we joined the Columbus Sail and Power Squadron, America's Boating Club of Central Ohio, we had our boat inspected and learned a good bit. Since then, as a certified examiner, I have been on hundreds of boats which gave me great ideas on what kind of boat Sue and I would want this time around. How else are you going to be invited to look around 10 to 20 boats in a day with the owner in tow helping you to know his or her boat?

I have a challenge for you, take a look at the Vessel Safety Check Website at <http://wow.uscgaux.info/content.php?unit=v-dept> and open the VSC Manual button in the middle of the page. Review the table of contents and decide to study the manual. After you have done that, head over to the National Sail and Power Squadron safety site at: <https://www.usps.org/index.php/departments/12000/12900/12900-vessel-safety-check>. You may need your E number along the way. (Login to the USPS web



site. Then go to site index and choose Vessel Safety Check.) Once you have reached the Vessel Safety Check site, about 1/3 of the way down the page find the highlighted area that reads "Take the Exam as it works now". Take the test and pass!!

Now you are ready to come to the classroom review on April 19, 2020 at the Columbus Squadron headquarters. Lt John Pruitt, AP, will hold a review for certified Vessel Examiners and newcomers who have completed the test satisfactorily. PLEASE BE THERE AT 5:30PM – 7:30PM APRIL 19, 2020!!!

Any member or interested person (Sea Scouts included) can come help us with Boat Exams during Safe Boating Week. We will be at Alum Creek on May 16 and 17 conducting Vessel Safety Checks on lots of boats. Hope to see you there!

Hate Exercising? I've Got Good News!

I live with women. Women who are not hesitant to speak their mind. They have no 'political correctness' governors on their mouths. Like 'Dad your stomach is over your belt. Are you laying away food for the coming zombie invasion?'. I catch my wife's sidelong glances while I'm toweling. Daughter 2B pats my stomach as she walks by and then gives me a smirky smile. Okay, I get it.

Honestly, I just don't like to go to the gym. But the nagging is really getting to me. I had to come up with a plan to quiet these women. All of this forced me to head into my quiet space.

My electric reclining chair with Wi-Fi! It's where I go to reflect on the vagaries of life. To solve nature's puzzles. To nap. Which I call 'reflecting'. Recently, after a week of 'reflecting', I had a fabulous idea!

While reclining, really daydreaming about getting to work on the boat, I had an epiphany. What if I could make all the activities of 'spring fitting-out' into exercises! Then I could tell Sharon I was going to 'work out' at the boatyard. And she'd eagerly tell me to go! Whip myself into an 'Adonis-like' male god!

So, I got busy and developed the following exercises:

Warm-up also known as Visit the West Marine Store

Arrive at the Port Clinton Store. Step out of your car leaving your cash and credit cards in the glove box. While walking towards the entrance lengthen your stride to get legs warmed up. Head up and put some pep in your step. Can you feel your heartbeat increasing? Your eyes dilating? Grab the store door handle and pull straight towards your abdomen. Simultaneously step over the threshold. Eyes straight ahead start in the boat shoe department; while you already have a new pair, this area will slowly get you to warm up. Then head down the aisle with mooring lines, anchors, life jackets, etc. The same. You've already got all you need just another selection to prepare you for the big push. Electronics! Moving briskly down the aisle, head scanning left and right, glance at the new radar by Lowrance, the VHF offerings with AIS signals, and the latest handhelds. Resist the urge to stop and shop. Turn and head to the door; you're warmed up!

Head to your boat (gym.)

Stair Climber, Subtitled Ladder Climb

Stand with both feet shoulder width apart, knees bent. Brace your core muscles and slowly lower your hips until your stomach presses against your belt. Grasp both sides of the ladder you have positioned against the side of your boat. Raise your dominant leg to the height of the first rung, look up, activate your core and then raise your body to the first rung. Repeat with your other leg. Don't look down. Repeat until your head comes equal gunnel. Repeat this until you've got all the shrink wrap off the boat. A great squat exercise!

For further instruction about climbing ladders around boats contact Roger 'Oops' Hankle.

Laying Crunches also known as Sanding Your Bottom

Lay on your back. Wiggle and shimmy under your boat heading towards the keel. Don't let the jagged rocks digging into your back distract you. Engage your core and lift your arms simultaneously to reach up to sand the bottom of your boat. Variation: While sanding, hold your head off to one side so that the dust doesn't fall into your eyes. Keep your abdomen tight throughout. Another variation: Once you've wiggled into position, remember you left your sander outside. Wriggle back out. Repeat.

Cleaning Out the Bilge and Engine Compartment also known as Planks

Laying on the floor (deck) of your boat reach into the cuddy and drag all the contents outward. Be careful around the fishing poles with hooks. Pay special attention to the anchor and anchor rode. Variation: Make it a Superman. Raise your feet at the same time as you're reaching forward. Second variation: Lay on your back, plant your feet shoulder width apart, raise your derriere, while looking and reaching backwards under the engine compartment to get that screwdriver you dropped. Great exercise and it will get rid of that incessant rattling while underway.

Prone Horizontal Eyelid Lifts

Lie face down on a soft cushion after having a big lunch. Engage all the major muscle groups of the human body in a futile effort to keep your eyes open. Variation: Supine horizontal lid lifts with soft-palate noise suppression. Same as above except do this faceup with a pillow over your open mouth.

Finger Thrusts also known as Calling Your Favorite Boatyard

Only do this exercise when you've 'had it!'. From a seated position, with your favorite cocktail close by, grasp your iPhone and punch in the number of your favorite mechanic, carpenter, dealer, et al. Variation: Hook-up your boat and drag it to the dealer.

Do you agree? Isn't going to my 'Boat-yard' gym a lot better than your neighborhood health club? Drop me a note. I'll read it after my next 'reflecting' session.
