Meet David and Melanie Stacy

Spend just a few minutes with David and Melanie Stacy, and you'll quickly catch their infectious energy and passion for adventure. Always up for a new journey, the couple purchased a 24.5-foot 2007 Rosborough RF246 in October 2022. Soon after, they connected with the ABC Central Ohio group and enrolled in the Boat Handling Course.

Armed with their new skills, they took their Rosborough -affectionately named Big Door Prize — on their first major voyage in February 2023, cruising 250 miles from Astor to Ponce Inlet, Florida. In early 2024, they were at it again, this time navigating a 500-mile route from Stuart, through Lake Okeechobee, to Punta Gorda, Florida.

While their recent boating adventures are

impressive, the Stacys are no strangers to life on the water. David fondly recalls his parents' ambitious 9-10-day journey in 1978 down the Kentucky River on a brand-new Viking deck boat. With no marinas along the route, the trip required months of planning, fuel deliveries by truck, and camping along the banks. Inspired by that memory, David and Melanie later recreated a portion of that trip, cruising 67 miles to Frankfort, Kentucky through four of the original locks still in operation today.

In addition to Big Door Prize, the couple owns the original 1978 Viking and two personal watercraft they've piloted on Lake Erie between Putin-Bay and Kelleys Island, and in the intercoastal

waters of Charleston, South Carolina.

Boating may be a major part of their lives now, but their

adrenaline-fueled adventures started long before hitting the water. David raced in NASCAR and even served as a crew chief, while Melanie competed in Quarter Midget cars at Columbus Motor Speedway in Obetz, Ohio. David, a skilled fabricator, has also built race cars, developed a wedding venue, and is currently constructing a new home for the couple

in Springfield, Ohio. For a glimpse into his resilience, David encourages you to check out the "David Stacy Daytona Crash" video on YouTube—a powerful reminder that he's truly a survivor.

David and Melanie officially joined ABC Central Ohio after attending the 2023 Oktoberfest Club Dinner at Schmidt's. Since then, they've completed the Cruising Under Sail and Power

course and are currently enrolled in the Navigation class. They love the friendships and community the club offers and are always surprised more boaters haven't discovered it.

Be sure to join us at our May Dinner Meeting at El Vaquero, where David and Melanie will share highlights from their recent March 2025 trip to Key West. They'll also give us a sneak peek at their exciting plans to celebrate the 200th Anniversary of the Erie Canal, cruising from Seneca Falls to Rochester, New York.
