ABC/Central Ohio Member Spotlight

Martha Beidel, ABC Historian

There's a compelling reason Martha Beidel was recently named Historian of America's Boating Club of Central Ohio, also known as the Columbus Sail and Power Squadron. Martha hasn't just studied the club's history-she's lived it. With a remarkable memory and a treasure trove of vivid boating stories, she's a natural storyteller and a beloved link

more boats." But as every true boater knows, the call of the water never fades. Eventually, friends persuaded them to "just look" at boats in winter storage. It was their daughter, Terrie Lynn, who spotted the 45-foot Chris-Craft they would eventually purchase and completely restore—new engines, furniture, and even a redesigned galley. That

to the club's past.

Martha's boating journey began in the late 1940s when she met Harold, the man who would become her husband and partner for over 70 years. At the time, she was new to boating, but Harold, an avid fisherman, introduced her to the water on their early dates at Buckeye Lake, renting small fishing boats.



boat, like every Beidel boat before it, was named Terrie Lynn and proudly made of wood. It remained on Lake Erie until August 2022, marking three decades of cherished memories.

Martha and Harold's boating life was deeply tied to the Power Squadron. When they bought their first boat, they took a boating class of-

The three-decade boat, the 45' "Terrie Lynn".

While Harold fished, Martha enjoyed simply being out on the water with him.

Their shared love for boating quickly evolved. Their first boat, a 16-footer, helped them learn to water ski on the Scioto River. That was soon replaced by an 18-foot boat they ordered after attending the Cleveland Boat Show-cutting-edge at the time with its inboard/outboard engine. The Beidels drove to Pennsylvania in their red-andwhite Chrysler to pick up the red-and-white boat, drawing smiles and compliments for the perfect color coordination.

They spent nearly seven years boating on Lake Erie before upgrading again—this time to a 28-foot Owens cabin cruiser, which they docked at Bar Harbor after being inspired by yet another boat show. Then came Martha's dream boat: a 36-foot Chris-Craft with two bedrooms and two heads, docked at the Catawba Island Club. It had belonged to Judge Tom Herbert of Columbus and was in pristine condition. Harold, seeing Martha's joy, turned to her and asked, "Did you bring the checkbook?"—ready to make a down payment on the spot.

Tragically, in 1991, their beloved boat and five others were lost in a devastating fire at the Bar Harbor docks. Heartbroken, Harold declared, "No

fered at The Ohio State University. There, they not only learned the essentials-navigation, engines, weather, and seamanship—but also built lifelong friendships. One such couple, Dean and Sally Pape, ran the Galley Gossip newsletter, and Martha fondly recalls helping them assemble issues on their living room floor.

Back then, women were not permitted to be club members. So, they formed the Sea Gals, a vibrant support group that organized fundraisers, created decorations for events like the Change of Watch, and even purchased the conference table and chairs still in use at headquarters. The Sea Gals grew from the original Anchor One-where members hosted events in their homes-to Anchor Two's restaurant nights out, and later, Anchor Three.

Martha remembers some of their more playful escapades: decorating boats and cruising the Sandusky River, dressing as pirates to "capture" other boats and "steal" their treasure, and even dinghy races around Bar Harbor. Today, though the Sea Gals have dwindled to about a dozen members, they still meet monthly for lunch, sharing stories

careers, always making new friends and sharing her creative talents—especially through ceramic gifts. She continues to attend the club's monthly dinners and serves as its unofficial storyteller, ready to recount the adventures, people, and vessels that
