

Important Membership Info

USPS changed its computer system this year to IMIS. Some information did not transfer over from the old system. Please take a few minutes to check your own record for errors.

1. Go to www.USPS.org and log in to the membership portal with your credentials. Usernames can be either your email address or record or your certificate number. If this is your first time logging in, click on "forgot password" to create your password. Your password must contain 7 characters and include at least one letter and one number.

2. Under your name in the top bar, click My Account.

3. Your record will come up with several tabs.
a) "About Me" shows your demographics, email, phone, mailing address, and who you are associated with. You can edit this information on your own.

b) "Participation" shows which squadron you

are attached to, when your dues are to be paid, and copies of invoices or receipts.

c) "Preferences" are what publications and emails you wish to receive from National. You can change your password here and add a payment method for future dues.

d) "Achievements" include grade, rank, merit marks received, vessel examiner numbers, total years paying dues, and certified instructor information.

e) "Education" shows the classes and seminars you have taken, along with the date.

f) "Past Jobs" lists all positions you have held with the squadron, district, or national. If any of your information is missing or incorrect, it can be fixed by sending an email to Yvonne Hill at hilly@hq.usps.org. Please include your full name and E# with a phone number in case she needs to reach you. Include what is missing or incorrect in the email.

Sheryl & Jason Mack

Meet Jason and Sheryl Mack, our newly elected Commander and Administrative Officer of the America's Boating Club® of Central Ohio. While it may seem like they've been part of our club forever—thanks to their constant participation and enthusiastic involvement—they actually joined just over two years ago, in October 2023.

Their journey to membership began in a simple and very modern way: a social media post. Jason and Sheryl saw an announcement about a picnic at Alum Creek and decided to check it out. What they found was a welcoming group of friendly, fun people who shared their passion for boating. They soon signed up for a Boat Handling class, where they met fellow newcomers Melanie and David Stacy. After attending Oktoberfest at Schmidt's, the decision was easy—they officially joined. Have you ever noticed the 5-gallon stone jugs on top of the bookcases at the clubhouse? A closer look reveals several rows of names, each with a corresponding year. The Bungle Jug award is given in fun, and sometimes with a pun, each year to a member who had a difficult or embarrassing experience with their boat on a large body of water.

This happened on our way back from Torch Lake when we reached the boat ramp. We had about six boats that needed to be loaded onto trailers, so several of them had to wait. Sheryl had dropped off Jason so he could retrieve the trailer, then waited nearby, floating near the ramp.

Unfortunately, the waiting area was close to a field of stumps marked by a few floating markers. It was also a windy day, and the wind was pushing boats toward the stump area. As a result, Sheryl drifted too close to one of the markers, which was using a fender as a float to indicate danger. The rope attached to it became tangled in their prop, stalling the engine and preventing it from restarting.

Others quickly came to her aid and helped move the boat over to the ramp. There, they were able to load it onto the trailer, where they discovered a cinder block tied to the rope. With the stern still in the water, they cut the rope and cinder block free from the prop without causing any damage. After that, the engine started right up, and it appeared that no harm had been done.

Still, it's not often you get to snag a cinder block with your stern drive.
