

USCG Boating Accident Summary

The U.S. Coast Guard recently released its report on boating-related accidents for 2009. A total of 4,730 accidents were reported for the United States that included 3,358 injuries and 736 boating-related deaths. While the number of deaths increased slightly from 2008, the number of accidents and injuries reported last year slightly decreased. Nearly 3 in 4 boating-related deaths resulted from drowning and among this group, 84 percent were not wearing a life jacket when their incident occurred. The U.S. Coast Guard report also revealed that 14 percent of the boater deaths occurred on boats where the boat operator had received an approved course of boating safety instruction. The report showed only one death listed for an operator who was given instruction by the US Power Squadron!!!!! THATS BECAUSE OF THE GREAT INSTRUCTORS AND STUDENTS WE HAVE. Alcohol use was the leading contributing factor in boating-related deaths nationwide in 2009.

The minutes of the August meeting were approved.

Commander's Comments, Cdr Michael Hughes

Tracy and I erected the 3rd and final sign at Buckeye Lake at the end of August. This civic project was funded by a grant from The National Water Safety Congress. Again with the help of Goodale Pro Hardware, their power auger assisted some, but there was lots of rock that had to be hand dug. This proved to be the toughest installation of the three.

Lt/C Matt Murphy and I attended the Bellevue Washington National Governing Board Meeting in September. National is making some major changes that will entice people to join. Matt will give an in-depth report on this tonight.

All registrations for the D29/D9 Fall Conference should be submitted with payment by Oct 10. This conference will give us the opportunity to meet many people from the Michigan areas – what a great way to find new boating destinations for our meeting in November. The theme of this conference is "Famous Pairs" so find your costumes for the Friday night event. There will be squadron hospitality rooms and all will be decorated. Reports of Officers Executive Officer, Lt/C Matthew Murphy

My apologies to the ECOM for missing the August meeting. I was traveling on business.

As indicated in my September GG article there was much learned and many By-Laws were changed. These By-law changes further enabled the intention of the changes made at the National level in February, 2010. A Member is a Member is a Member was the mantra for the National Governing Board meeting in Bellevue Washington and seemed to guide all meetings including the actual proposed and approved changes to the National By-Laws. This of course is aligned with the Chief Commander's direction which is "Membership is Job One." The intention is to simplify the definition while empowering members. The changes provide that members will have the same opportunities and rights as any other member. The exception to this is members under the age of 18 may not hold an elected position or vote at any business meeting. They may however earn merit marks, serve on committees, attend business meetings and proudly wear a uniform and fly the ensign. The Squadron membership process must still be followed for all new members. Squadrons must soon change their By-Laws to more closely match those of the recently passed National By-Laws. The process will take several months but this is exciting news.

More changes have been made which enhance membership recruitment as well as facilitating the ability to offer classes to the public. One of the key questions that seemed unanswered was how do we issue a certificate or order a test for a non-member? The answer to that is non-members are tracked in USPS University. If a non-member becomes a member, the Certificate number is transferred into membership.

Another announcement was made about web site secure access. Members will need to use their PIN for access January 2011. An option has already been added to allow members to set up an authorization phrase that allows the site to send you a PIN reminder. Two key items to note here are that one must have their email address current in their member profile and the second is to set up the questions and answers to allow the system to send you the PIN. Access to this system enables members to manage some of their information, pay dues, and search for additional squadron member information.

One of the key enhancements to allow members to access information is the "Information Center." There are two ways to access it. Navigate to USPS.org and click on "locate things." Select Information Center. It is also located on the "Site Index."

The \$25.00 member set up charge for first year members has been repealed.

Brunswick Corporation, the parent corporation for boat manufacturers such as Hatteras, Boston Whaler and Triton Bass Boats has announced they will work with in initial 50 of their dealers to support the efforts to hold Squadron Boating classes



and seminars in the dealerships. The goal is to increase traffic in the dealerships while providing a facility to our volunteer organization. Such support will be in the form of advertizing and promotional funds.

The ABC3 course will offer a six month trial membership free with the class. The goal is to teach the new members about the benefits of membership with the Squadron and include them at events. There are huge improvements to the member benefits package. Some enhancements include discounts on travel expenses and deeper insurance discounts. Included in the insurance discounts are further reduced premiums based upon completion of courses and Boat Operator Certification level.

We learned that the Canadian Power Squadron includes the first year of membership with their version of the ABC course. This has attributed to significant growth in their membership and they have a high retention rate.

In the South Hole Long Island New York school district an interested middle school teacher now teaches the ABC3 adapted course to middle school students as an elective course offering. The District sells the course to the school system and school fees cover the cost of materials. To instruct the course the teacher was made a member and can proctor the final test with assistance from the district squadron.

There are more notable things to report than I cannot remember or decipher from my notes. Please review the USPS. org web site, subscribe to SailAngle and read the Ensign for more information.

If you received a loaner Mustang inflatable PFD from ODNR for personal use they have recently sent out packets requesting that it is either returned or another year toward your pledge to wear it. Please turn in your response and take the survey. More positive responses will likely enhance the funding for the program.

Prepare for winter storage

Be sure you have the skills to perform tasks such as wiring and plumbing. If you have any doubts, consult a qualified specialist.

Before sealing up your boat for the winter, now's the time to thoroughly check the vulnerable parts and equipment that could cause problems next spring.

Examine through-hull fittings. If ignored, these fittings could literally sink your boat. Although most newer vessels have plastic through-hull fittings, older boats have bronze fittings, which are susceptible to electrolysis, i.e., stray electrical impulses in the surrounding water. To test these fittings, give them a gentle tap with a small ball-peen hammer. Don't overdo it. If the metal has deteriorated, it will crumble and must be replaced. While you're at it, you might as well replace the engine seawater intake fittings with dual intake suction/bilge-type fittings. These come in handy when you need additional bilge pumps in an emergency.

Check all electrical connections, including the batteries. Clean off any corrosion and lubricate the terminals with WD-40 or a similar lubricant.

Examine your canvas curtains and Bimini. Thoroughly clean them with fresh water, and treat them with a good preservative. You don't want them tearing while you're going full throttle down the middle of the bay.


Fill your fuel tanks. Moist air entering the vents will deposit water (condensation) in the tanks. If the tanks are full, there's not much room for condensation. While you're at it, add a fuel stabilizer.

Now, your boat will be ready to roll when it hits the water next spring.


