I hope that this issue of the *Galley Gossip* finds you all doing well. I know that this has been a difficult time for all of us. And making it even more challenging is not knowing what still lies ahead. This will certainly affect our upcoming boating season. If you have a boat and will be able to access it, it may be an activity that we can do and still exercise self-quarantining and social distancing.



Before you go boating this year, however, you will all to need to check a few things outside of your normal check lists for getting your boat ready for the season. First, check with Ohio Department of Natural Resources to find out if

the marina where you boat is open and what type of restrictions that may exist by checking the <http://ohiodnr.gov/> website. Second, if we still must self-quarantine or have social distancing restrictions, only go boating with those whom you have been with during this quarantine; do not take your friends or neighbors. Do not raft up to others at your favorite spot nor get close to other boaters (don't crowd their space and if they crowd yours, move).

When we do see the light at the end of this dreadful tunnel and are allowed to start venturing out, and we will, please do not forget to visit your local marinas, small shops, and restaurants. All of these business will need our support to recover. Remember we are... **America's Boating Club!** Our support matters and we are strong. Please do all that you can to stay well!



Wow! It is time to launch our boats or well almost?! Now let's use our heads and do this right. If you have the latest *Boat U.S. Magazine* you may have seen a great article about the 14 tips you can use to insure a better chance of a great launch and first splash of the season. If you are careful you may even save the whole season. Here are the tips that I believe are great for those of us who have trailer boats:

Tip 1. Check the bilge pump with the battery switch set to On and some water that you ran into the bilge. If the pump starts and pumps a steady stream you should be ok. Now, I have two bilge pumps on my boat so I must open the floor compartment (sky locker) and pull the bottom plate up so I can see what happens to the water in my fresh-water shower. Both pumps need to work.

Tip 2. Control cables including throttle, shift and steering cables must work easily and without major stiffness. If you hear a strange sound or you don't get the expected direction change, have the cables checked, especially in a boat that is ten years old like my I/O...it could be a major safety issue.

Tip 3. If you have an I/O drive, you need to inspect the bellows around the area of the transom where the drive moves. Look for tears or holes in the membrane. Some folks have actually sunk by failing to take a simple visual check. Run the drive



up and down and look from every angle.

Tip 4. Check your drains and hoses in your fresh-water system and in the engine compartment. After launch is not the time to find out that your serpentine belt which runs the engine and all the parts is worn.

Tip 5. While you are checking the bellows in Tip #3 or if you have an outboard, you need to inspect the lower unit for signs of oil leaking. That could be caused by ice from water in the unit. Have your mechanic pull it apart and be sure those gears are working as they should.

Tip 6. Safety gear should be checked out. Do you have flares and are they in date? Fire Extinguisher in the green and in working order? Do you have life jackets and are they in good working order? What about a throwable? Do you sleep on the boat? Check your carbon monoxide detector... batteries? Does the VHF radio work? How about the flashlight?

Tip 7. Check all fluid levels and be sure that they are at the right level. Don't guess; if the level is not right find out why before you launch.

Tip 8. Check your electrical connections. Are they tight and secure? Has corrosion started forming? Fix this before you are stranded on the water. Do you have fuses? If so check to be sure they are working before you leave the dock.

Last but not least, if you are a sailor check the rigging! Every other tip applies as well. Have fun on the water and God bless us everyone.

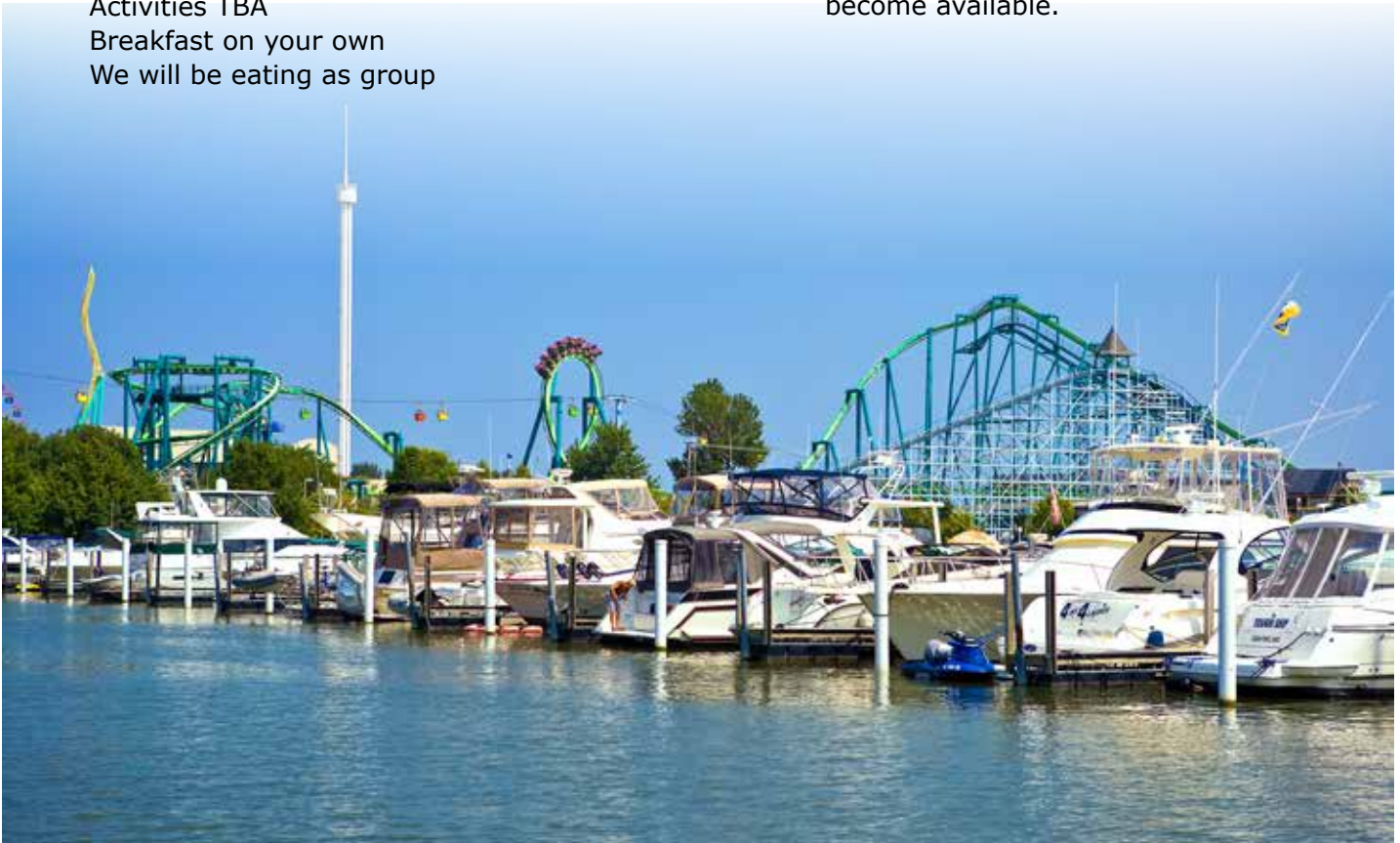
