





The Alum Creek Sailing Association will not allow power boats to use their docks. This essentially eliminates our hope of having on-the-water training at Alum Creek.


ABC Retention: We need to try to do a better job at retaining our recent ABC graduates. Some things which will be done in the future are as follows:




