

Well, you will find these answers and more once Skip Woodruff finishes teaching Weather!!! Come join him and Tom Morehouse on Mondays at 7:30pm. The class begins January 31, but there is still room and it runs for 10 weeks. So get your hats and gloves and head for headquarters and join the fun.

How would you like to feel the breeze blowing through your hair and the mist hitting your face as you sail along in the Caribbean? Well, before you go too far in that dream, come join Ken Spilke and Doug Jackson as they teach you all

about Sailing. This 15 week class that begins on Tuesday, February 1; again at 7:30pm. I would highly recommend this course to everyone, even if you have never sailed. 
