



**Administrative Officer, Lt/C Thomas Norman**

Election Night was a blast with snow again this year. You elected Matt Murphy as the incoming Commander with Tom Norman Executive and Dave Canale Administrative officers. Roger Hankle was recognized for 50 years of service and Robert Rayburn was recognized as the outstanding club member for 2010. Eli Murphy was recognized with a proclamation by Commander Hughes declaring the day as Eli Murphy Day for all the work Eli did during the year – "always ready to dig holes, paint hillsides, and any other activity." The food was delicious and the service was even better. The Lakes went way out of their way to make a wonderful evening even better. We almost had a full house. Thanks to all of you who braved the snow and cold.

Several months ago I wrote about the Blue Algae at several lakes around Ohio. We had a presentation from ODNR about their problems and the EPA testing at the August meeting. There was a front page article in the Dispatch "ALGAE 'FIX' disappointing" December 31, 2010. There were three tests performed in Grand Lake St Marys and two tests showed marginal improvement and one of the tests failed. This is disappointing news for all Ohio boaters and especially true for the businesses and residents around St Marys. All of us are pulling for restoration of Grand Lake St Marys as well as other lakes around Ohio. There were 19 lakes cited as being hazardous around Ohio. This is a serious problem with no remedy on the table. All boating, swimming, fishing and recreational activities have been suspended at Lake St Marys.



Last summer I wrote an article about gasoline, specifically E10 which is regular gasoline with 10% ethanol added to the mixture. This was mandated by Congress. It is reported that the mixture may run to all other octane. The Federal Government is forcing distributors to increase the 10% mixture to 15% for this coming year. Many companies in the boating industry including USPS have raised complaints as the new mixture has not been tested and that ethanol has an adverse effect on motors and fuel systems. I interviewed three marinas for their input to the problem. Buckeye Lake Marina, Alexandra's Landing and Paul's Marina all have expressed problems. There are replacing seals and fuel lines for both IO's and Outboards. A big problem for Mercury is their fuel lines of their newer outboards all have to be replaced due to a plastic liner in the fuel lines that shrinks cutting off fuel due to ethanol. These are two serious problems that affect power boaters and sailors.

### Educational Officer D/Lt Debbie Smith

Classes have begun and we have a good start. The first class for Marine Electronics saw 4 students and last night saw 3 students for Piloting. On Jan. 30 we see the wonderful world of Weather, on Feb. 1 Sail class and on Feb. 21 the ABC3 class begins. So we are off to a good start. I am waiting to hear from the JN instructor and see if we can get a class started in the spring. We have had several phone inquiries about our classes from non members, so we will see how that avenue goes. One non member is currently beginning Piloting.

As Jeff begins the new ABC3 class, we hope to see many attending our Seamanship class which will begin on April 11, as everyone who takes the ABC course will have a free 6 month membership. This hopefully will be another avenue to ramp up our courses as well as membership.

**Lt John Seaver** – Will contact the Columbus police to determine their interest in a basic boating course for officers. Lt Seaver will handle the repair/replacement of the microphones.

The meetings and sessions are full of information to pass along to our Squadron. I will try to cover the more generally interesting items here. Members' benefits continue to expand. Examples are prescription drug benefits, car rental discounts, travel and insurance discounts. Another 14 by-law changes were also passed to clarify the wording of previously passed changes pertaining to member types. The intention is to reduce complexity and promote Family Unit pricing. If Family Unit pricing is favored, Squadrons and or Districts may also pass the changes.

Members under 18 may serve on committees and take part in discussions to shape decisions of the committees. Less than age 18 members may also wear a uniform, take classes as members, and earn merit marks. Two things that members under 18 years cannot do are vote at business meetings and hold Chair or Elected Positions. With that in mind there is a lot that 'under 18' members CAN do.

The Sea Scouts is an amazing organization that I very much wish to support in Central Ohio. It is co-ed. Its members are guided to take ABC3, Seamanship, and Piloting. Scouts are led by other Scouts who operate the "Ship." Discussions, decisions, and educational sessions are led by the Scouts. Scouts are encouraged to be Power Squadron members. The meetings are very much action-oriented and a great social time. Sea Scouts quickly learn to handle boats, tie knots, learn to sail, perform maintenance and

more. They learn while they socialize. Scouts must have graduated 8th grade and or be at least 14 years of age. At age 21 they are dismissed from Sea Scouts but they may continue membership and build their love of boating with the Squadron. 

## What's new with VHF DSC Radios?

When you go to buy your new VHF DSC radio this spring, you will find some changes in them from last year's models. That's because the Coast Guard has mandated an upgrade on the safety features.

Since DSC (Digital Selective Calling) first arrived on VHF radio's there has been two classes. The lower cost class SC-101, which many boaters purchased, and the class D, more expensive model.

The SC-101 utilizes one receiver to monitor channel 70 (the DSC emergency frequency) and the everyday communications. If the radio was busy on another channel and an emergency call came in, the single channel could miss the emergency call. The class D monitors two channels.

All of this year's VHF radios will include a dual channel receiver that constantly monitors channel 70, even when you are on another channel. Now boaters in distress will have a better chance that their Mayday alert will be heard.

Don't forget to obtain your free MMSI (Maritime Mobil Service Identity) code by going to <http://www.usps.org/php/mmsi/home.php> and then program it into your radio. Until you do this, your DSC functions will not work. The new radios will flash a warning "NO MMSI" and sound an alarm reminding you to take care of this situation. Old models do not!
