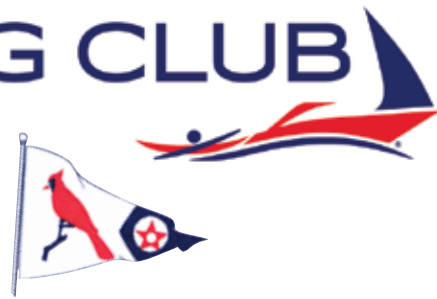

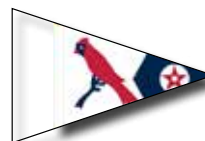
What do you do with your boat in the winter in Central Ohio? Well, sometimes I drive out to where my boat is stored and just spend a few minutes looking her over. Ostensibly, I do this just to be sure she is secure and the wheel covers are still on and tight. But the real truth is, I just sit in the warm truck and stare, daydreaming about putting her in the water and going on a cruise.



However, a quick glance at the latest issue of Boat U.S. magazine shows me what I could be doing. I could be checking the anchor chain to be sure the rode has not frayed or that the chain is in good shape. Or if you have an I/O drive like I do you could check the seals on your outdrive struts. A year ago, I found the drive sagging a bit. I wish I had seen it sooner...replaced the struts seals and connectors! Then, you should check your outdrive bellows, the membrane seal that protects your

outdrive from leaking through the transom. We changed that last year as it had cracked from age and use. Maybe the toughest thing to see is the fuel tank fill hose which can cause fuel to leak into the bilge. Oh my! As a vessel examiner, the thing I see most often and the easiest to fix is the blower tubing that exhausts fumes from the engine area. And one I have never thought of is the bilge pump cracking from freezing temperatures.

Oh well, so much for just sitting in the warm truck dreaming of on the water adventures. See you on the water this spring...can't wait!
