As this reaches you, all of us on your Executive Committee hope you have had a great summer of boating. The Prior family certainly did, but not only on our own. They are not only fun but equally rewarding in new friends made and crucial boating information gathered. We will circulate sign up information via e-mail once we receive it. During the warm weather months, we spend more time up at Lake Erie. In so doing, I often listen to radio station WJR (AM 760) out of Detroit; they offer solid content. It is one of the few 50,000 watt "clear channel" stations authorized by the feds. Another reason I like to listen to that station occurs when we are out on the water. Crackling and static on such a power signal is a solid clue that "weather" is moving in from the west.

You've undoubtedly read of the recent accomplishment of a Great Lakes Compact consisting of a very solid agreement



by the US states and Canadian provinces which are contiguous to the Great Lakes. It covers the use and protection of all its waters. In the regard of many, achieving the compact is a long overdue and an essential breakthrough badly needed to protect this valuable resource. However, the ink was barely dry on it when some of the more strident environmentalists received a great deal of alarmist

ink because the use of bottled water wasn't specifically addressed; gloom and doom was being spread high and low.

I happened to be listening when WJR hosted and interviewed a marine attorney and degreed hydrologist who was very impressive! His command of the facts and the compact was extremely impressive. He provided statistics to illustrate that the current use of bottled water from the Great Lakes is statistically insignificant. The authority also outlined several checks and balances in the compact that would prevent runaway use of Great Lakes' water in bottling. Even a worse case scenario, which would never be permitted to happen, the use of bottling water would be somewhere around 1% of the water supply. It is always refreshing to have facts to extinguish fiction.

Energy Conservation and the Art of INSULATION

Many years ago during a public speaking class at OSU, back in the mid 80's, I made a statement which, to say the least did not impress my professor. I tried to link Energy Conservation and National Security together asking everyone to turn off their lights and conserve for National Security. The idea was young and was just getting started.

Growing up in New Jersey during the gas embargo of the 70's taught me one thing; life is hard without gas for your car. Many years have come and gone and now we hear a lot more about Renewable Energy and going Green. But the one that seems the most logical is still Energy Conservation. Let's face it; saving what we have is very important. Today as in the 1970's adequately insulated homes not only save money for homeowners every month, but they also help Americans conserve vital energy resources for the future and keep the demand pull factor from forcing energy prices higher. Remember, last year at the gas pump, lower supply higher demand. There are many ways we can make our homes more Energy Efficient but the most significant way is to check our home insulation either by you or by a professional. Insulation keeps your home warmer in the winter and cooler in the summer. Insulation performance is measured in R values, its ability to resist heat flow. The higher the R value the greater the resistance to Energy loss. Different R values are recommended for walls, attics, basements and crawlspaces, depending on your homes and geographical location.

Insulation works best when air is not running though it or around it. So, air sealing of penetrations is an important process before insulating to get the highest performance and energy savings.

In Ohio, the Department of Energy suggest that our attic insulation should be R- 49, Walls, R - 18, Floor over unheated areas R - 25 and crawlspace walls R -19 to make our homes efficient. Many of our homes I inspect come very short of these suggestions.

Another good reason for insulating, besides conserving our natural resources, reducing greenhouse gases and saving money, is from our government in the way of the America Recovery and Reinvestment Act. This bill provides for a tax credit of 30% of the cost to insulate up to

\$1500.00 for the calendar year 2009 - 2010.
