Growing Our Club

Growing our club is sometimes like growing grass in a dry, arid area (not very easy). I have personally invited many people to join our club with limited success. I keep at it. I have probably given my "elevator" speech about our club 50 times before I get a person to want to come to a class or an event. I have asked myself several times how I might go about this in a better way. This is what I am currently trying out when I meet a boater: I ask them questions about how, what, where they like to be on the water. Often this leads the other person to tell me about a need or problem with their boating pleasure. Based on their response, I often have the opportunity to then tell them about how much fun I have had going on a trip with my boat and other boaters;



how we helped each other when we had a problem out on the water; a class that I have taken to help me to understand my boat better; or my boating adventures. And, ultimately, I invite the person that I just met to join me or our group in a fun activity or to take a class.

The moral of my story is to find out what aspect of our club would best motivate that person to want to learn more about our organization. By merely finding out some basic information and really listening to these fellow boaters, it can enable good follow up questions, which can lead to an invitation to a class or fun event that would be relevant to that individual. I also can link them to our website for more information. The bottom line is to get them to one event or service that can lead to a lasting connection to the club.

It is always fun to learn what other boaters' experiences are so this is a great way to engage with people while promoting our club in the same conversation. Give it a try and help build our club!



Recently, we have all been touched by the "Virus". We are living inside and wearing masks and it is getting old. Yesterday, we could not stand it any longer, so we went to our boat storage, opened the gate, and drove in to find our boat under cover and in relatively good shape...some dirt and dust, overall just fine. We resisted the urge to jump in the truck, hook the boat up and splash. Instead we put 303 on all the leather and cleaned and waxed (started waxing) the Secondwind as she is known.

So, what precautions do we need to take knowing the Covid-19 changes we have all endured? How does this menace affect boating? And, in particular, since we stand for, teach, and believe safety first is always the best approach to our water experience, how does the "virus" affect us as boaters? Common sense says we should keep social distancing and wear a mask and gloves at the gas pump.

Boat US says we need to boat with only our family and those who live in our home to prevent the disease from spreading as best we can. If you are at the marina, keep a safe distance in mind and wash your hands often and use hand



sanitizer when it makes sense. Prepare your boat ahead of time instead of waiting to put out your fenders, lines, and check the drain plug during the ramp experience. Once you are launched, put off the urge to raft up, and forego beaching your boat right next to others.

You can check US Fish and Wildlife closures by state if you are planning a trip to find out how Covid-19 has affected your destination. Tow Boat US and Sea Tow both have updates daily about how to serve you if needed. Just be wise about knowing your location and what changes have been put in place.

Now a few observations on what we experienced after we got tired of working on the boat yesterday... We drove over to the Alum Creek Lake marina and were not surprised at how much fun it is to watch others launch and retrieve their boats. People are not courteous by nature and the

Boat Operator Certification Program

I have had several people ask me about the Boat Operator Certification Program and, since we have a Boat Operator Certification session coming up in August, I thought I would pass along some information about the program.

The Boat Operator Certification program recognizes the skills of USPS members at different levels of recreational boating proficiency. A certified boat operator will represent the fulfillment of a USPS training program: an operator who is knowledgeable, competent and safe. To achieve certification at a given level, a candidate must complete Advanced Grade courses, Elective courses and USPS Seminars relevant to that level. In addition, candidates must demonstrate their proficiency in a set of practical skill tests. BOC Certifiers are trained to conduct and evaluate these skill tests and provide coaching to members for skill development.

There are currently four levels of certification available to members:

Inland Navigator
Coastal Navigator
Advanced Coastal Navigator
Offshore Navigator

Inland Navigator is the first level of the BOC program. The focus is on basic powerboat

operation and general boating knowledge. The Basic Powerboat Handling skills are the same skills included in the Hands-On Training (HOT) program.

Coastal Navigator is the second level of the BOC program. The focus is on coastal operation and coastal navigation. Inland Navigator certification is a prerequisite.

Advanced Coastal Navigator is the third level of the BOC program. The focus is on extended coastal operation and advanced coastal navigation. Coastal Navigator certification is a prerequisite.

Offshore Navigator is the highest level of the BOC program. The focus is on extended operation out of sight of land. Advanced Coastal Navigator certification is a prerequisite.

For more details about these programs go to usps.org, Members Log In, Site Index, Boat Operator Certification/On-The-Water Training, Boat Operator Certification (BOC) Program.

Be advised that a USPS Passport for the level of certification must be purchased from the SEO to participate. If you wish to participate contact me at pmking01@att.net or 614-267-3246 and I will order your passport as soon as possible.

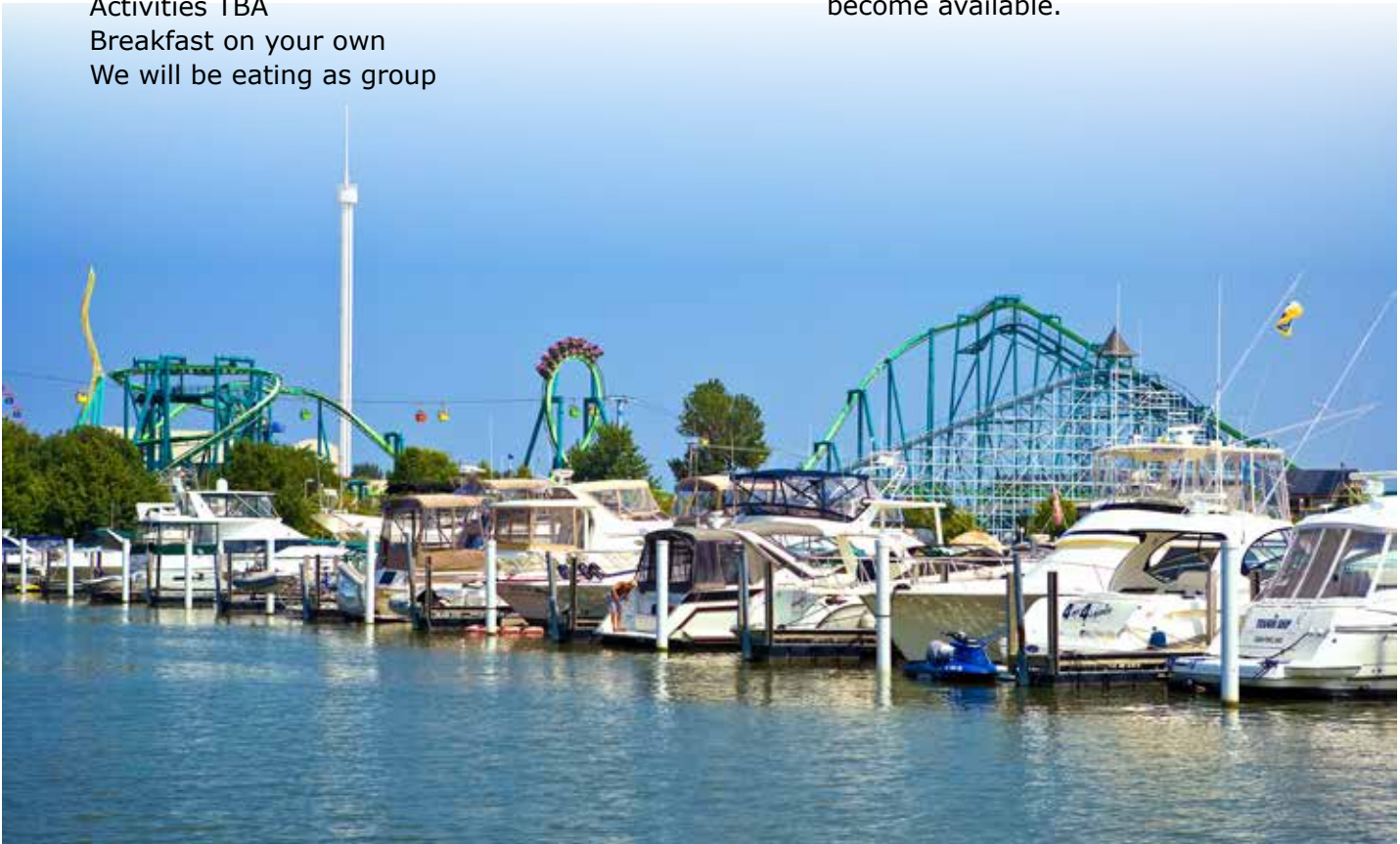
